Background:

MESAA is the abbreviation of *Medi Educational Support Association for Afghanistan*.

It is one of charity, non-beneficial, non-governmental and non-political association. MESAA was established to participate in the rehabilitation of Afghanistan. It's main objective is to provide required assistance to those school children and education workers who has difficulty in commuting due to their physical inabilities

MESAA was established in 2002 and after completion of first year wheelchair project under umbrella of Japan International Friendship and Welfare Foundation (JIFF), MESAA got official registration from Ministry of Planning of Islamic Transitional Government of Afghanistan in 2003, this gave MESAA the ability and chance for implementing of its projects needed and to participate in the rehabilitation of war torn Afghanistan.

Implemented Projects:

Since its establishment MESAA had implemented the below mentioned projects:

2003- Distribution of 100 wheelchairs through JIFF.

2004- Program for relief of educational materials for poor students.

Seventy really poor students received materials such as school bag, cloths, stationary, shoes etc which was enough for one year.

2004- Distribution of 100 wheelchairs.



2005 Program of Wheelchair/tricycle Follow up done for about 100 wheelchairs.

Distribution of 70

new wheelchairs and repairing of 13 Wheelchairs/tricycle.

2007- Inspection of 70 wheelchair/tricycle and repairing of 7 wheelchairs/tricycle.



2008- Inspection of 65 wheelchairs/tricycle and repairing of 7 of them.



2009- Distribution of 13 new wheelchairs; Inspection of 100 wheelchairs/tricycles which 21 out of them have been repaired.



2010- Distribution of 24 new wheelchair; Inspection of 65 wheelchairs/tricycles which 23 out of the have been repaired.

- First experimental locally production of 4 Tricycles.



2011- Distribution 24 new wheelchairs and tricycles; Inspection of 50 wheelchairs/tricycles which 13 out of them have been repaired.

- Experimental locally production of 4 Tricycles.



2012- Distribution of 11 new wheelchairs; Inspection 47 wheelchairs/tricycles which 10 out of them have been repaired.

Summary 2013:

With this year financial and technical support from Minsai Center Japan (MCJ) and Collaborative Music Workshop (CMW) we were able to distribute 12 wheelchairs and two more will be distributed to needy people in KABUL City, city schools and training centers. Also eight wheelchairs and tricycle were repaired and four to five more will be repaired. The direct beneficiaries (receivers) and indirect beneficiaries (family member and teachers) of this project were very cheerful, appreciative for all in touch and asked for spread and continuation of this project. We started implementation of project as soon as school started. Screening for new receivers and following up with broken wheelchairs and tricycles were done which you which you can see above.

Supplementary Comments:

1. We the MESAA staff has been trying hard to make the best use of our limited financial assistance we have been receiving in recent years, even with minimum payments.
2. Continuation of this project added one more year experience to MESAA background and keep MESAA going to help disadvantage people.
3. We purchase original products (China) because of its reasonable cost and the availability of its parts. Therefore, as our after service care, we need to use part of our budget for most essential parts to be replaced in case of damage. Otherwise, most of the receivers are not able to afford it by themselves and the wheelchairs will be left unused.
4. This project indeed is a great help for these really disadvantage people which there is no attention to them or very less attention.
5. The project is always well received by all direct and indirect beneficiaries.
6. MESAA staff is grateful to MCJ and MCW for providing us with a chance to be in the service of our needy people through your kind cooperation and support.

Once again we are grateful to the members of MCJ and MCW for such a kind and humanitarian aid. For sure it will help the receivers to widen their horizons of life and be more self-supporting in their daily activities.

We look forward to continuing your kind support in this regard in the future.

Evaluation and outcome of tricycle produced locally:

We have meet with all users of local made tricycles, the overall status was acceptable but we found the locally available new wheels used to these tricycles were weak for those who used it more than 5 hours a day. One out of four local made produced wheelchairs was in need of wheel and we were able to find better quality and replaced them will follow up inspection of the situation.
